
#### Middle Grade – CH Discussion Questions and Light Lessons

#### CH 22 REMEMBRANCE


1. P. 210 What does Jesse learn about Elizabethtown from Tim Braedon? How does Jesse get away from Tim?
2. P. 212 Veterans' Day was once called Armistice Day. Do you know why the time and date are important (11 – 11 – 11)?
3. P. 213 The great composer, Dvorak, wrote his phenomenal "New World Symphony", full of dancing jigs and haunting melody. Later one of Dvorak's American students wrote words for that haunting melody, which has since been used for many funeral and



memorial services; most notably for President Franklin Delano Roosevelt. That song, by William Arms Fisher is known as “Goin’ Home”. This is a recording of it to give you an idea of the meaningful, moving lyrics:

4. P. 212 How does Jesse get his Doughnut Song mixed up? (*Dona Nobis Pacem* is a Latin phrase. What does it mean? Listen to the song – Do you hear how Jesse may have gotten the words wrong? ([https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=gKz\\_aBRhCIk](https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=gKz_aBRhCIk)))
  
5. P. 213 *“If you have Love, you don’t need to have anything else. And if you do not have Love, it doesn’t matter what else you have.”* What do you think of these words about Love? What does Jesse have to say about love? (See Light Lesson Quote below – 213)
  
6. For some silly fun, try substituting a different word for “love” – say, “pizza” –  
*If you have **pizza**, you don’t need to have anything else.*  
*And if you don’t have **pizza**, it doesn’t matter what else you have.*
  
7. P. 214 In Jesse’s bedroom the clear shadows felt like puzzle pieces and he thinks: *Everything is like a puzzle, waiting to fit together.* Do you sometimes see your life fitting together like puzzle pieces? How do they look? What shapes do they take?



8. P. 215 On board Liam's tugboat, what do you learn from Steve about Tim Braedon? How do you feel about Tim Braedon?
9. P. 215-216 What is the Golden Door in the harbor? To what does it refer? Look up the poem and the Statue of Liberty (History for Kids: - -  
 - easy poem with video: <http://www.history-for-kids.com/statue-of-liberty-poem.html>;  
 - original poem by Emma Lazarus: <https://www.ladytorch.com/statue-of-liberty-poem.html>)
10. P. 216-217 What does Mac say to Tim Braedon that lets you know he is a thief and a scoundrel? What do think of Jesse's idea to inform Sgt. Hannity of the missing items?

Ch 22/ 212 - "The 'Doughnut' song - You know: 'Doughnut—No Cheese—Pasta—Pasta.'"


Ch 22/ 212 - "Actually, there is no such thing as NOW. 'Cause, as soon as you say NOW, it's gone. It's past."
